#### Cemetery Chapel seriously damaged in fire ...

Local fire crews were called during the early hours of Sunday 18 April to Clare Cemetery to find the Chapel building on fire.

The fire caused extensive damage to the roof and internal structures of the building. The contents were completely destroyed including the Parish Council's new street sweeping machine which was being stored in the building. Swift action by fire crews and the substantial construction of the outer walls prevented the building from collapsing.

Built in 1886 the Chapel was provided for funerals, prayer and reflection but in the last fourteen years only two funerals have been held. Whilst remaining available to anyone who wished to use it, the Chapel was being used as a store for Parish Council equipment.

Fire investigators and police remain puzzled as to the source of ignition for the fire as there is no heating in the building nor are main services connected to it. Some evidence of possible forced entry through the main chapel door was found therefore police are treating the fire as suspicious.



Police are appealing for anyone who may have been a witness or have information about how the fire started to contact them or contact Crime Stoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111.

The Chapel building is now a dangerous site and has been secured until decisions about its future can be made. The Parish Council are asking parents to please warn their children about the dangers of entering and playing in such a site.

## Chapel's future - your opinion ...

The Parish Council are now faced with the dilemma of deciding the future of the Chapel building and they would like to hear your views on that subject.

Parishioners are invited to contact the Parish Council before the 30 June to express their views or suggestions about what the future of the building should be.

A range of possibilities exist ranging from full reinstatement to demolishing the remains

using the site for another purpose such as a memorial garden.

#### Speedwatch Volunteers Needed ...

One of the major concerns expressed by parishioners in the Clare Community Plan was the risk posed by speeding drivers in certain parts of the town.

The Safer Neighbourhoods Police Team already carry out speed checks but there is an initiative that they would like to run in Clare which also allows members of the community to become actively involved in monitoring speed. The Community Speed Watch campaign will equip and train a team of volunteers in Clare to do just this.

The campaign is designed to monitor the speeds of vehicles in various locations thought to be risk areas to establish if there actually is a problem and how serious it is. The data compiled is then used to determine when and how much police enforcement action is required or to dispel concerns. The presence of the team also creates a visible deterrent to potential offending drivers who can see they are being monitored.

# Clare First Responders need new members ...

The Clare, First Responders, are seeking new volunteers to help keep this vital service running in our community. Since the First and brief Responders were established in early 2009, the group has received a number of

requests from the Ambulance Service, and has been able to respond quickly and effectively to life threatening situations.

First Responders are asked to attend an emergency by the Ambulance Service when they think a first responder will be able to arrive in advance of an ambulance. They then give initial first aid treatment. This early assistance can be critical in cases where survival rates are significantly improved by quick action such as a cardiac arrest. Emergency equipment (including defibrillators) is allocated to whichever of the First Responders is on standby.

The type of calls First Responders are asked to attend are life threatening emergencies such as heart attacks, chest pain, cardiac arrests, fits and breathing problems. They are not asked to attend traumatic incidents such as road accidents, fights or childbirth.

> After training by the Ambulance Service, each volunteer contributes as much or as little time as they are able, receiving support from the rest of the group. There is a local coordinator who arranges the

rota and the day-to-day running of

the group and there are regular meetings to enable volunteers to exchange views and experiences, to coordinate activities and to update training. Support is given to the group by local ambulance staff.

After some quick-thinking and reorganisation, our guests rounded off their week of activities with an unplanned excursion to Portsmouth to get a ferry to France as they were unable to fly home due to the volcanic explosion in Iceland!

We hope that our French guests will have fond memories of a special few days spent with new friends in Clare. Michel Hetroy, the Mayor of Chatillon, summed up the week by saying "Chatillon may have won the trophy, but the people of Clare have won our hearts".

#### Come and join the Clare visit to Châtillon 11-14 July?

Following the great success of our French friends' visit to Clare in April, planning for the return visit in July is well underway.

The programme starts on Sunday 11 July and includes live broadcast of the World Cup Final on a Big Screen in the Champ de Foire.

On Monday there is an official opening ceremony with the raising of the National Flags and National Anthems. Entertainment includes historical pageants, a parade of Citroen 2CV's and visits to a local chateaux.

A major attraction on Tuesday will be a European Market with local and European specialities. 60 stalls from four countries are already booked and three will display Suffolk tourism, artisan work and food and drink.

For the U14 boys, there is the return football match against Châtillon where we hope to regain the trophy! For non-footballers there are other sports on offer including tennis, badminton and boules. The Tuesday evening will see a traditional Parade of Lanterns, regional dancing and musical entertainment.

Wednesday 14 July is the National Holiday when in addition to visits to local national parks and wine producers, visitors will enjoy the traditional 14 July parade followed by a dinner alongside the swimming pool and a firework spectacle.

A 49 seat coach has been booked, (and paid for by EU funding!), which will take our U14 footballers and a dozen pupils from Stoke College accompanied by a number of adults. This transport is entirely free to Clare residents, and there are still a few places available. If you wish to join in the fun but travel independently, then Châtillon is a six hour drive from Calais.
