Progress in battle for a Clare Car Park.

The ongoing battle to solve the issue of parking in Clare for residents, businesses and visitors alike continues.

On 14th June, 4th July and 4th August the Parish Council, assisted by the Clare Business Association and Clare Society, will be carrying out a survey hourly to determine the need and actually availability of parking spaces at a given point in time. The survey is part of the joint Parish Council and Borough Council initiative to try and resolve the parking problems in Clare.

The Parish Council will also be sending a questionnaire in July to every town centre resident and business seeking their views on parking issues.

Cllr June Smith who is managing the survey said' The Borough Council has ask us to



determine through a survey the current demand and supply for car parking in central Clare. We are very aware of the impact of parking problems for the business in the town, the residents who live there and shoppers trying to support local traders. For the shops to remain viable, access is needed. It is vital that a solution is found, that is why the Parish Council has agreed to take on the survey'.

Cllr Smith would like to appeal to residents and businesses in the centre of Clare to complete and return their questionnaires as everybody's experience is vital evidence for the survey. Your Life - in their hands.

Cardiac failure is survivable in most cases provided cardiac pulmonary massage and resuscitation commence almost immediately according to recent medical research. CPR maintains the heart rhythm and the supply of oxygen to the brain and vital organs through blood circulation. To ensure that anyone unfortunate enough to suffer a heart attack in the parish has immediate assistance a team of volunteers have come forward to be Clare First Responders.

The team are about to start training with the East of England Ambulance Service and when operational, will provide 24/7 cover for the parish.

Despatched by Ambulance control, the First Responders will be trained to recognise the basic signs and symptoms of cardiac problems. They will start CPR with the aid of a Defibrillator and manual depression of the chest. The will also be able to maintain an airway, give oxygen and deal with any life threatening bleeding. Their swift intervention will provide that vital basis for professional treatment by paramedics and hospital staff.

Providing cover everyday of the year will be challenging and the team will need more help. If you think you might be able to help this vital service by volunteering please contact Matt Lovejoy on 01787 278223 for further details.

New Challenges / New Leadership.

The coming year is likely to see significant changes in how local government is managed in the west of the County. The St Edmundsbury Borough Council local plan contains proposals for consideration that Clare becomes a Key Rural Service Centre and would therefore have to provide a standard of services that could attract significant investment into the parish.

The District Council may included in a new unitary authority as part of reforms being considered by the Boundary Commission due to report in early 2009.

The Parish Council has the opportunity to consider and contribute to the debate upon how these issues will impact upon the parish. Therefore if you have a view or would like to find out more, then come to the monthly Parish Council meeting held every third Thursday in month in the Old School Community Centre at 7.00pm. Parishioners can ask questions and have their views recorded in the process.
